Dear Mr. Chairman:

As provided for in the Panel's letter of December 22, 2006, the United States is providing the following comments on the draft descriptive part of the report of the Panel:

List of Abbreviations, "IHA": The cite should include a cite to the pertinent volume of the United States Code, and thus should be "15 U.S.C. §§ 3001 to 3007".

List of Abbreviations, "Wire Act": The cite should be "18 U.S.C. § 1084," rather than "18 U.S.C. §§ 1081, 1084."<sup>1</sup>

Page 2, footnote 8: There is an error in the document symbol for the minutes of the May 30, 2006 DSB meeting; the document symbol should be "WT/DSB/M/210".

Annex C-2, page C-12: In the heading between paragraphs 18 and 19, the words "Complaining" and "Responding" should have initial capitals.

Annex F-2, page F-32: On this page, Sub-question (c) of Question 31 is reprinted twice; in the second instance (found between paragraphs 83 and 84), Sub-question (c) of Question 31 should be replaced by Sub-question (d) of Question 31.

Annex G-2, page G-32, paragraph 2: Only the phrase “bring the measure into conformity” should be underlined, and thus the underlining should be removed from the remainder of the paragraph.
